Scott's Spot

Welcome to the Christmas edition of Cross and Keys.

Through the season of Advent we have been preparing for the coming of the Christ Child of Bethlehem. Of course, we know that in the weeks leading up to Christmas we are preparing ourselves for the wonderful celebration of the events that took place at that first Christmas - angels, shepherds, a mother and baby all gathered together in what we might nowadays recognise as a shed behind the local pub. So we have, at an ever increasing, frantic pace made our Christmas preparations. Buying gifts, gathering food and drink and making arrangements to gather with family and friends in various ways.



Alongside all of this hustle and activity our Advent liturgies and in particular the weekly readings have directed us towards a larger picture, the more cosmic aspect of Advent and Christmas which is a slightly different picture - the second coming of the Christ.

Both of these realities, the back then and the yet to come help to inform our present lives and give us a fuller picture of the significance of incarnation, God coming to dwell with us, to be with us. Both help us to live fully in the here and now and to make sense of our current reality. Both are part of our Christmas celebrations in the here and now and if we place too much emphasis on one and neglect the other I think we do ourselves an enormous disservice.

When we reflect on the incarnation – God coming to be with us in the person of Jesus of Nazareth - we can easily fall into the trap of imagining that God only decided to come and be with us later in time to fix a problem or to correct an error. At some level we can be forgiven for believing this as it has been one the classical understandings within Christian theology for generations.

Recently I have been reminded by Dr Samuel Wells, the Vicar of St Martin in the Fields in London, in his book, "Humbler Faith, Bigger God", that it is possible and perhaps likely that God always intended to incarnate and be with us because relationship is the very essence of God. God has never existed in isolation. The Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Spirit exist in a dynamic relationship of love. So why then wouldn't God want to share that love with us and draw us into that dynamic relationship. Why wouldn't that have always been God's plan?

This is what we celebrate at Christmas. The joy and privilege of being invited into the very heart of God which is a dynamic relationship of love. It is in this relationship that we can find the peace we so yearn for in our lives. It is in this relationship that we can experience the deepest joys that we so desire. It is in this relationship that we most fully live out who we are as human beings and share that love with others.

May God bless you and those who are near and dear to you this Christmas and in the New Year.


I would like to thank everyone for their continued support and especially Fr Scott for his faith in me to run the shop and provide a safe and happy environment for volunteers and customers.

St Francis and St Clare Window Dedication


Sunday 11th December 2022 was a big day for our Parish and for all the donors of the long-awaited St Francis and St Clare windows.

Parish Pantry Christmas Giving!







It has been a **HUGE** year for our Parish Pantry with almost 2,000 food parcels being distributed to people in need within our community.

Each Wednesday our group of volunteers unpack the truck and sort through a tonne of donated food which is a mixture of frozen, fresh and pantry items.

Our recipients register and pickup each week and are extremely grateful for all they receive.

Our sincere thanks also go to the **Slow Food Network** who supply us with pre-packed cooked meals prepared in their kitchen which can be easily reheated by our clients, they are a huge hit with everyone!

This Christmas we will distribute 60 Christmas Hampers filled with all sorts of goodies for Christmas lunch or dinner. **Woolworths at Rutherford** have provided much of the hamper food items and we are very thankful to them for their continued generosity and support of our Parish Pantry.

In addition, this year we have also received a very generous donation for each hamper and have included a surprise \$50 food voucher. We know this will go a long way and help people who are already doing it tough, but especially in these times of high inflation where everything is on the rise.

We cannot finish the year without thanking our kind and giving **parishioners** who answer our call each week and donate pantry items which help us to supplement the food received from OzHarvest, Slow Food and U1R Patisserie at Maitland. Your donations also support our emergency parcels which are available 24/7 for those in special and urgent need.

These parcels are so important as we help the most vulnerable people at their lowest, escaping a violent situation or homelessness. Your giving goes a long way towards supporting our Parish Pantry ministry.




